Parents/Guardians:

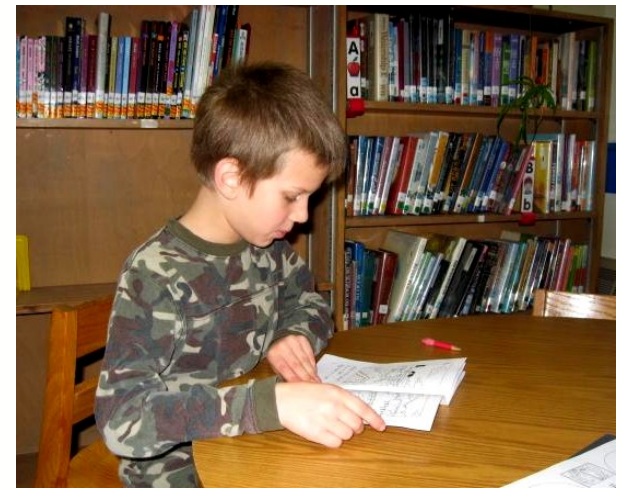
We offer:
