

Student Ownership For the Viking Voice



Lyndon Institute U.S. Fish and Wildlife Junior Duck Stamp **Contest Winners Announced**

On Tuesday, April 24th Lyndon Institute students and faculty welcomed Dave Frisque from the Missisquoi National Wildlife Refuge who visited the campus to present LI art students with awards for their participation in the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service Junior Duck Stamp Art Program and Contest.

Lyndon Institute senior Emily Colby earned the top honors of Best of Show for the State of Vermont. After the national judging, her artwork, along with the artwork of other state winners, will tour the country for a year. Additionally, junior Emmallie Bailey and sophomore Kasey Barton received 1st place acknowledgments, senior Jocelyn Pike, junior Xiaoyu Chen, and sophomore Ethan Brill received 2nd place, seniors Jakub Urban, Lyliana Davis, and freshman Trinitie Simonds received 3rd place, and senior Allyssa Hall-Hanson received honorable mention. The students' works were created with supportive instruction from Lyndon Institute visual arts teacher Barbara Follett.

Preparation for the Junior Duck Stamp Contest and involvement in the program requires students to study waterfowl anatomy and habitat. To follow, students express their learning and knowledge by drawing, painting or sketching a picture of an eligible North American waterfowl species. The program also provides an opportunity for students to artistically express the beauty, diversity, and interdependence of wildlife.

The annual Federal Junior Duck Stamp competition combines art and science to teach students in kindergarten through high school about migratory waterfowl habitat preservation and wetland conservation. All 50 states and US territories participate in the contest. The Best of Show from each state and territory are submitted to the national level.

LI Student Places Third in Statewide Business Plan Competition

Students enrolled in Lyndon Institute's Principles of Finance and Business course spent their last semester developing a business plan that was submitted for consideration in the tenth annual Vermont Student Business Plan Competition. The competition is presented by the Vermont Small Business Development Center (VtSBDC) and Vermont Rural Entrepreneurship through Action Learning (VT REAL) which, according to the VtSBDC website, is "an experiential learning curriculum that develops entrepreneurial knowledge and skills, and guides participants through the process of planning, creating, and operating small businesses of their own design."

Jordan Patoine, supported by instruction from his course teacher, TJ Tanner, completed his business plan as a part of the semester-length course. Upon completion, his was among those to be submitted for consideration in the statewide competition. Patoine's plan was then graded on a 100 point rubric which includes a detailed company description, a marketing plan, an operations management and organizational plan, and a financial plan. Following the scoring, the business plan submitted by Patoine was awarded third place for his efforts.













The annual spring dance recital is an opportunity for family, friends, the general public, and the LI community to come together and share in the learning of students in the Lyndon Institute Dance Program in the spring semester.

The performances featured students in the Dance Techniques and Elements, Jazz Dance, and Ballet classes, as well as students who participate in the auditioned based Dance Company, independent study, dance club, pointe club, hip-hop club, and tap dance club. Choreographies showcased learning in the foundational studies of dance technique and artistry (ballet, modern and jazz), and also demonstrated student skill and knowledge through the use of the elements of dance (time, space, and energy) to highlight understanding and communication of movement as way to interpret relationships and personal growth/development as well as how dance style/genre has changed through time.

The various dance styles and genres highlighted in the spring recital included: post-modern, modern contemporary, tap dance, musical theater jazz, lyrical jazz, traditional jazz, swing jazz, lyrical ballet, contemporary ballet, jazz hiphop, and interpretive dance. All of the choreographies featured are part of the LI dance curriculum which is aligned with the National Core Dance Standards and are collaborative products by the dance students and the LI Dance Teacher, Rebecca McGregor.

National Art Honors Society Induction

On Thursday, May 17th Lyndon Institute (LI) proudly welcomed students, families, and community members to the John L. Norris Center for the Arts to induct 18 student members into the National Art Honor Society (NAHS).

Students in the National Art Honor Society demonstrate outstanding artistic scholarship and service to the school and community through the development of artistic endeavors, together with a strong moral character. By exemplifying these standards, the individual student members of the society promote an awareness of art and become active participants in the education process at their school and in their community. Additionally, students are required to participate in community service and volunteerism in the visual arts, enroll in a fine arts class or have already completed a fine arts course, and attend NAHS meetings and activities regularly. The students who demonstrated the qualities associated with the NAHS criteria inducted this year include:

"It is a great privilege to teach art to such a dedicated and compassionate group of young people. Each day I am awe-struck by the incredible skill and talent that I am surrounded by. As I watch my students flourish with their artistic techniques, and develop a sense of curiosity about the arts, I have to wonder how art will impact their lives in the long-run," offered LI Visual Art Teacher Cynthia Helmbreck. "Wherever their path leads, I am certain that this group of students will always cherish their time spent at Lyndon Institute's Norris Center for the Arts, and I hope that they continue to pursue artistic endeavors for many years to come."

The Society welcomed artist and author Cynthia DeKett, also known as C.A. Morganis, as keynote speaker. DeKett is an artist, author, and educator from northern Michigan, who now makes her home in the mountains of the Northeast Kingdom. She is the artist and author of Emrysia: The Three Sisters Trilogy, and is currently completing illustrations for a new children's book on the fears associated with diagnostic testing, with which she hopes to raise funds for the Children's Hospital at Dartmouth. She is a cum laude graduate of Ferris State University's Commercial Art program, and was awarded a certificate of completion from the Institute of Children's Literature in Connecticut. She has also studied under artists Margaret Tvedten, Pat Deadman, and Stephen Huneck.

As an educator, DeKett provided art instruction while in Michigan, and taught music to the students at Good Shepherd Catholic School in St. Johnsbury. She has also worked in a variety of art-related fields, including as head painter for the Stephen Huneck Gallery. She is a staunch supporter of local arts and culture organizations, having donated her time to paint scenery for Vermont Children's Theater, as well as supporting the St. Johnsbury Athenaeum and others.

Alumni Profile - Eric Blake '94



Brooklin Boat Yard Project Manager Eric Blake recently applied his skills to support the creation of a sculpture commemorating lives lost in the 2012 Sandy Hook Elementary School shooting.

Born and raised in the Northeast Kingdom, Eric started building canoes in his father's shop when old enough to run a table saw. During his time at LI, Eric took several courses that helped to fuel his passions including courses related to drafting, manufacturing, and engineering. Following graduation, he enrolled in the Landing School's small boat design program in Kennebunkport, Maine and completed the City and Guilds Diploma Program in Traditional Boat Construction at Lowestoft, England. Since then he has worked in boatyards on both the east and west coasts. In his current role with the Brooklin Boat Yard, located in Brooklin, Maine, he supervised the construction of a series of yachts before beginning work in support of the development of the commemorative sculpture.

The wooden sculpture was designed by Massachusetts artists Rich Duca and Meredith Bergmann, both of whom worked in partnership with employees as it was constructed on site at the Brooklin Boat Yard. The sculpture, which is now complete, rests on four pedestals and has four circles of fiber-optic lighting inside, each of which represents one of the four teachers killed during the school shooting. It is displayed as the centerpiece of the Southern Connecticut State University Reflection Garden.

The Southern Connecticut University website states "The Reflection Garden Project strives to promote our communities' shared experiences of joy and sorrow through the creation of a public garden on the Southern campus to highlight social justice and service to others."

Project Bike Tech

Three years in the making; Lyndon Institute won a Program Innovation Grant from the Vermont Agency of Education to bring Project Bike Tech, as part of Career and Technical Education (CTE), to the region for the 2018 – 2019 school year.

This program utilizes mountain bicycle technology, trail construction and maintenance, and adventure tourism education as a channel for teaching core academics.

"Travel and tourism, specifically organized around biking, is an important part of the Kingdom's identity. We are excited that students in the region can incorporate biking and technology into their core education at Lyndon Institute" said Dr. Jason Di Giulio, Director of CTE.

Project Bike Tech uses bicycle mechanics as a conduit to teach Common CORE and STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math) elements to students. The curriculum consists of components from the systems diagnostics, service, and repair elements of transportation, with subjects from travel and tourism, such as adventure and ecological tourism. Students in the program also incorporate career building skills and techniques as a component of their experience, and they will leave the course knowing the basics of portfolio building, resume writing and interview tactics.


To further the scope of this new offering at LI, Kingdom Trails signed on to collaborate by providing free passes for all of the students in the program and work with program faculty to offer internship opportunities for students. "Kingdom Trails is grateful for the opportunity to be involved with the new Project Bike Tech program at LI! KT hopes to aid in offering handson, fully encompassing experiences for the students, involving all aspects of the bike industry; trail building and development, retailer relationships, event and race production, marketing, and so much more! These experiences will only add to their Bike Tech certificate, building their resume as they head out into the field," said Kingdom Trails Director Abby Long who will also serve on the advisory committee.

The search for an instructor for this new CTE offering found Mike Lowe who is an accomplished national mountain bike racer and former Gould Academy faculty member and Dean of Community Life. Lowe is a Category 1 Mountain Biker/Gravel Racer and has achieved numerous Single Speed wins. He has a love for this sport and is excited to build the Lyndon Institute Bike Tech program. "It is an honor to take on this role for LI and the community," said Lowe.

"Bike Tech at Lyndon Institute is an innovative, creative pathway to one of our region's most exciting assets. We are thrilled to have found an instructor whose energy, enthusiasm, and abilities will help our students earn success in school, life, and the Northeast Kingdom" said Dr. Di Giulio.

Project Bike Tech is a two-year program at Lyndon Institute where students earn industry certifications from manufacturers. Whether graduates directly enter the workforce or continue on to college, they become aware of how core academic principles can be applied in real-world situations, how cycling can lead to a

healthy and green lifestyle, and how to properly present themselves as a prospective employee regardless of where they pursue a career.

The highlight in the fall, for sure, was field hockey winning the state championship for the first time in program history. It took 58 years to get this one, but I'm guessing that it won't take 58 more to get another! The program is strong with over 40 players on this year's varsity and JV rosters. Look for good things to come! Football qualified for the Div. 2 playoffs for the first time in 4 years. With a good nucleus of young talent back, this year's team should provide some excitement.

Volleyball continues its growth, as both boys and girls teams played in the state tournament last fall. A quality group of returnees for both teams should spell success on the court in 2018.

Cross Country has made a comeback of sorts. For the second year in a row nearly 20 student athletes fill the team roster. By the time the state championships are held in late October, the LI boys and girls should be up for the challenge.

Coach McCarthy (boys) and Coach Leafe (girls) are working hard to get the soccer programs into the top tier in Vermont. Being placed in Div. 1 has made playoff success elusive, but both teams are competitive in every game and ready for the challenge.

The winter season's highlight was the rebirth of boys hockey. For the first time since 1993, the team made it to the championship game. Their loss to Woodstock in the Div. 2 final didn't dampen their accomplishment. The team graduated 9 seniors from that team, but those returning know what it takes to be successful.

Girls hockey, in their second year as the NCU/LI team, had a breakout year. With only 2 seniors on that club, this year's team is primed for success. Sharing practice and game time between the Ice Haus in Jay and Fenton Chester Arena, the commitment these young ladies have shown is admirable. Look for them to take another step forward this year.

The boys and girls basketball teams once again found success. With both having very successful regular seasons, their placement in Div. 1 made playoff success very challenging. The boys lost to MMU in round one and the girls to BFA-St. Albans in round one as well. Our new head coaches will once again have the Div. 1 playoffs to deal with. Both are excited, however, to be taking over programs left in a great place by Eric Berry (girls) and Phil Joyal (boys). Both Coach Berry and Coach Joyal did an outstanding job of building our programs into prominence.

The Alpine ski team had a fine year, ending their season by hosting the Vermont Alpine State Championships at Burke Mountain. While the boys and girls team's didn't challenge for the top spot, they did have some outstanding individual performances throughout the year. The Nordic team continues to struggle with numbers, but individual performances by freshman Holden Middleton and senior Joe Wray led the way in the state meets. The emergence of Indoor Track in the winter season has led to many top notch performances and full rosters for both the boys and girls teams. Camryn Heath has moved to the pinnacle of elite throwers in the state, and Lyndon's hurdlers continue to impress. The team will sorely miss the talent of the graduated Zosia Prince, one of the top distance runners in the state.

It would be a mistake not to recognize our cheerleaders. They are the spirit of the fall on the football sidelines and

of the winter on the basketball court. They also compete in the state cheerleading championships every year in late February. This team is talented, athletic and loud! In the spring, the softball team lost in the first round of the playoffs for the first time in more than 20 years. However, there's a twist. Our team was placed in Div. 1 this year and that proved to be a significant challenge. Now that they have a taste of that competition, they'll be ready this spring!

The same can be said for baseball (also placed in Div. 1). Behind the pitching of senior Brandon Brunell, the team was extremely competitive all year long, but the Div. 1 playoffs were a different story. They fell to #2 Brattleboro in round one, but not before taking them to the limit in a 4-1 loss.

Track and field had some very impressive individual stats, but came up a bit short in the team totals at the Div. 2 state meet. They return some high quality talent so watch out for the Vikings this spring!

Ultimate is fairly new to the Vermont high school sports scene. This year both of Ll's teams made it all the way to the state championship match. The boys lost to Burlington High School and the girls to Montpelier High School, but getting there was quite an accomplishment. Look for Ultimate to be a contender year in and year out. It's popularity is growing!

All in all another great year for LI Athletics. Thanks to all of you for supporting our student athletes as they learn life lessons on the playing fields, courts, rinks and slopes. I hope to see you at one of our events.



2018 Distinguished Alumni Award




